The Advent Journey Towards Christmas . . .

By the time you've picked up this copy of *Eleven Says*, Advent will have begun. Advent comes to us as a time of kindling light amid the growing darkness of the world.

The Advent wind begins to stir
With sea-like sounds in our Scotch fir;
It's dark at breakfast, dark at tea,
And in between we only see
Clouds hurrying across the sky
And rain-wet roads the wind blows dry

The beginning of John Betjeman's poem 'Advent 1955' reflects the damp chill and shortening days as we move towards the Winter Solstice on December 21st. Beyond it, we will celebrate the Saviour's birth.

However, this month can feel out of step with nature's slowing down into winter - more like a headlong rush. So many Christmas events, including carol services, happen during Advent that we can forget that Advent exists.

The name of this new season derives from the Latin 'Adventus', which means 'the coming'. It is a time in the Church's year of waiting for God to act, for heaven to come down to earth. It's a healthy discipline in a frantic world to allow ourselves time to be still and enter this time of profound waiting.

Jesus comes to earth as the light that shines in the darkness. Give yourself time to experience the darkness he came to illuminate. We try to keep the darkness at bay during the long evenings by switching on the lights, putting on the TV or radio or communicating on our phones. Instead, put the lights out, leaving just one on, or lighting a candle. Switch off the sound and flickering images. Draw back the curtains and look at the night sky. Let your body be still and listen to the unaccustomed silence.

If you want to go further, think of the darkness of the world that Jesus came into. Think of the darkness in our world today. Think of the darkness in our lives that he came to illuminate and heal.

If you want to go further still, there is an ancient Advent prayer that uses just one word: 'Maranatha'. It means, 'Come, Lord.' Say it slowly, reflectively, thinking about people or situations we're concerned about. We can say it for ourselves as well. When we're ready, we can put all the lights back on and go back to our normal activities. This kind of Advent journey can be made without leaving the room.

But it can take us a long way towards the loving heart of God, who made us and waits for us to be still with him. It can feel hard for us to do this, even for a few minutes. That is why he sent his only Son Jesus to be born among us. He came closer to us, so that we can draw near to him.

Betjeman's poem ends with these words:

'The time draws near the birth of Christ'.
A present that cannot be priced
Given two thousand years ago
Yet if God had not given so
He still would be a distant stranger
And not the Baby in the manger.







"Upon this Rock"

Norfolk church buildings are full of mystery, the silent history of peoples' lives and this country's stormy wars of religion. There are over 1000 churches of which 682 are still in use including, St. Peter's, Bramerton.

Recently we were very fortunate to have Dr. Ian Hinton from the Historic **Buildings Group** come and tell us about our Church. which it's believed was re-built in 1462.



We walked around the Church outside and looked at "Decorated" windows. Could some windows have been inserted in older walls? Dating parts of a church is always difficult. We stared up at the tower which had been built in three stages: the lower part possibly 13th century or even Norman; then the belfry stage for the bells, and finally the parapet. Ian pointed out how to spot the annual builds, known as lifts, which went on between March and September, starting with a thick mortar course and larger stones which became smaller as the year's build progressed and we thought of the masons working so long ago.

He pointed out the putlog holes for scaffolding. We looked at different shades of Norfolk cobbled flints. shiny knapped flints, and a medieval sundial or was it a mass dial engraved in south facing stone?



On entering the Church through the medieval door, he pointed out the sanctuary door ring, hold on to that and you would be safe, and on the inner door catch a saltire, a symbol that stops the devil from entering! The Church still has its priest's door, where before the Reformation the priest entered the chancel to keep himself separate from the congregation, who had their own area called the nave. There are slight remains of the rood screen which also kept the priest and congregation apart until torn down by Protestants, although the rood loft stairs are still visible. There is one thing we can definitely date and that is the north transept built in 1860 in memory of John Blake. Churches are mysterious places which leave you with so many questions.

Incidentally you may think of Norfolk churches as centuries old, but think again, the rocks from which they are built may have been left by two ice ages, or be part of the Bramerton crag with fossil sea shells in the rocks from when the North Sea covered the Broads. Look at your church with new eyes, but recall the real meaning of "Upon this Rock". Christ re-named his disciple Simon and called him Peter (Latin for rock) and told this ordinary man that he and people like him were to be the foundation of Christianity. Let's remember a church is more than just a building, it is people.





Surlingham In Time

Some of you may remember, back in April 2020, *Eleven Says* published a piece entitled *The Mystery of the Missing Vicar*. At the time, we were researching the medieval history of Surlingham. Now the fruits of our discoveries have been put into a book entitled *Surlingham in Time: Meeting the Medieval Ancestors*.

As the subtitle states, it paints a picture of the village and its people from the Norman Conquest of 1066 to the time of the first Queen Elizabeth in 1600.

As well as interviews with a selection of vicars of the period, we take an imaginary tour of the area in 1441, find out how life changed here as Normans took control of Anglo-Saxon Norfolk, trace the fortunes of the lords of the manor, and take an inside look at the poverty and



prosperity of the Elizabethan village community.

The two churches played a pivotal role in medieval life. St Mary's is still with us after a thousand years, while the evocative ruins of St Saviour's are a cherished heritage. But now the round tower of St Mary's, with its 14th century bells, is in dire need of renovation, to the tune of £130,000.

South Yare Wildlife Group

Richard Mabey in conversation with Henry Layte of the Norwich Book Hive

The South Yare Wildlife Group was honoured to host the author and broadcaster, Richard Mabey, in conversation with Henry Layte of the Norwich Book Hive at the Poringland Community Centre on November 4th.

Henry very ably encouraged Richard to elucidate on his knowledge and experience of conservation and nature writing over a career exceeding fifty years. In responding to a question on his thoughts on rewilding, Richard said that there was the problem that people wanted to be in control. He gave as an example what may turn out to be a conservation shibboleth of the vogue for tree planting. He didn't use the term 'natural regeneration', but he said that trees often grow better if land is just left alone. 'Hurray', I thought: I can show anyone who is interested more than one place where deciduous woodland is growing very nicely on land that has been left unploughed and ungrazed by livestock. No planting, no plastic guards, no watering, no weeding. There are situations, of course, where trees DO need to be planted – along streets for instance, or where there are not enough local seed sources.

In response to another of Henry's questions on changes to the countryside, Richard decried the effects of agricultural intensification on wildlife and the landscape with so many fields in

his local area of south Norfolk being ploughed up to the field boundary and hedges cut frequently and hard so that their value to wildlife is severely reduced. Again, this was not mentioned, but a new subsidy regime is being introduced next year where one of the options is for farmers to elect to be paid for cutting their hedges less frequently and no more than once every other year, instead of yearly, as so often happens at present.

In response to a question from the floor about what advice he would give to a group such as SYWG, he said, "raise money and buy land".





Silent Night

This much-loved carol comes from Austria, where it was first sung as *Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht* on Christmas Eve, 1818. It was written by Father Joseph Mohr, a young priest at St Nicholas Parish Church, in the village of Oberndorf bei Salzburg. As Christmas 1818 approached, he asked the local schoolmaster, Franz Xaver Gruber, to compose a melody for his carol. Gruber was organist in the nearby village of Arnsdorf, and so was happy to oblige. On Christmas Eve they presented the carol to the church during the midnight mass. The carol went on to become loved world-wide; and the version sung by Bing Crosby is the third best-selling single of all time.
