

# Bergh Apton Parish Council

## Re: Data Protection Consent

You may already know about the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) 2016/679 that aims to protect you and the personal information that organisations - including this Parish Council - hold about you. It was in effect from 25th May 2018.

Under these Regulations we must limit the purposes for which we contact you - by phone, mail, email and other media - to matters concerning the parish of Bergh Apton and the interests of its inhabitants. We must hold the information we have about you securely and we may never share it with others unless we ask you and you agree. You may ask us at any time to stop using your personal details for these purposes.

All these matters are included in our Data Protection Policy published on the Bergh Apton website [www.berghapton.org.uk](http://www.berghapton.org.uk) (on the Parish Council tab).

The GDPR requires that we obtain your consent to holding information about you that enables us to contact you. The Consent Form attached to this letter – if you return it to us to tell us that you agree with the terms defined in para 2 above - will permit us to communicate with you. Otherwise, within the terms of the GDPR, we cannot.
