
# Nothing lasts forever . . . except God's love for us

There is a story about an Eastern king who asked his wisest advisors to compose an inscription for a gold signet ring. It needed to be something that would be enduring and suitable for any time or season. The words they proposed were 'This too will pass'. At first glance this might seem a strange phrase to suggest but in a few single words it offers us a great deal of wisdom.

The words are a simple reminder not to despair. No matter how bad things might seem, how dark or difficult, nothing lasts for ever. Things will change, the clouds will roll away and life will eventually improve. I suppose that the opposite could also be true, we could read it as saying that good times will pass away too but that seems to be rather a pessimistic view. I prefer to think of it as a reminder to enjoy every second of the best days and make the most of them. That applies equally to those normal, not very exciting days. They might feel a bit dull but even they are filled with bright little moments that we should also be thankful for.

Ironically perhaps one of the most constant things in all our lives is change. Nothing stays the same. People come and go and things are always on the move, to such an extent that sometimes we feel that we have to keep moving just to stand still. Unfortunately change can be very unsettling even if it is something we choose for ourselves and we are looking forward to. A new job for example, can be very hard to get used to. Even if we hated our old one and were delighted to be offered something new, getting used to new ways of working can be hard. The problem is that what we could do really well suddenly becomes tricky and we go from feeling very capable to absolutely hopeless in the space of a few days. When that happens we sometimes start to look back and long for what we had - and yet if we stand firm, things will improve - this too will pass.

By the time this edition of Eleven Says hits the doormats I will be in the final stages of packing up my home ready to move to a new role and a new house. I have loved my post here but as a curate in the Church of England, I always knew that my time in the group was limited. I am in a training role, assigned to work with an experienced priest whose job is to help me learn what it means to be a priest in today's world.



After 3 years we are assessed and signed off ready to find a new role either assisting or being responsible for our own churches. Already I worry about my competence both at home and at work. Will I be up to the new job? Will they like me? Will we ever work out the recycling system for our rubbish?

And it is not just me on the move. August is the most popular month to move house perhaps because people like to go and view houses in the sunshine when everywhere looks at its best and there is less risk of the furniture getting wet if it is moved in our driest season. I also know of friends with new jobs to go to. Holidays often make us reflect on our work and people tend to start job hunting after a break, perhaps because they remember why they needed a break in the first place!

But probably the biggest group moving over the summer are the children. The school term always finishes with events to say goodbye to the leavers going up to secondary school or moving on to colleges or universities. Even those staying in the same school are moving classes and teachers and even the very little ones are meeting with their reception class teachers for the first time. It is all change.

There is however one constant in all of this and that is God's love for us. It will not change nor will it fade or fail. It doesn't matter where we start or where we end up, we can't hide from it or lose it. So if you are on the move this summer in what ever way, enjoy the adventure and remember, you are loved and in this ever changing world that is the one exception to the inscription's rule. # New Bishop of Thetford announced

On Wednesday 14th June Downing Street announced that The Venerable Ian Bishop is to become the next Bishop of Thetford.

lan will be ordained as a bishop in Westminster Abbey on 29th September 2023.

There will be a service of welcome for him and Sue at Norwich Cathedral on **Saturday 30th September at 5.30pm** to which all are warmly invited.

During his surprise visit to the Royal Norfolk Show, the Prince of Wales presented an award to a committed young Norfolk farm environmentalist .Prince William spoke to Robert Jackets, an apprentice at Salle Farms, near Reepham, while handing him the Bishop of Norwich Sustainable Environmentalist Young Employee of the Year Award.

Robert is studying on a crop technician course at Easton College, and grew up just two miles away from Salle Farms, dreaming of working on the large machinery there.

His application explained how Salle Farms limits its environmental impact, and his particular interest in the field margins established through



the arable farm's Countryside Stewardship agreement.

The Bishop of Norwich, the Rt Rev Graham Usher, was also on hand for the presentation of the award and its £1,000 cash prize at the Royal Norfolk Show.

The annual competition was judged by the Food and Farming Discovery Trust (FFDT), the education arm of the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association. It is open to employees and apprentices aged under 21, who work for a Norfolk-based employer within the land-based sector focusing on land management, conservation, countryside management, ecology, climate change management, forestry management or horticulture.

# News from the Rockland Parishes

By the time you read this, the Bramerton Group will have said a fond farewell to Revd Cate and lain Turner and their family. Cate's ministry began in challenging circumstances during the 2020 lockdown, but she was able to use her professional skills to help the Group embrace new technologies and offered a mature and compassionate ministry. Although her departure will be most keenly felt within her 'home' Thurton benefice, I feel sure that the communities on the Rockland side of the Group would join me in expressing our gratitude for her helpful involvement here. We wish Cate and lain success and happiness in their new life in Yorkshire.

Apart from those of us who work in farming and the holiday industry, August usually offers quiet spaces. Schools are closed, and many regular activities are at rest. However, we're looking forward to Carleton St. Peter's Flower Festival on August 5th (11am-4.30pm) and 6th (10.30am-4.30pm) depicting 'Rock and Pop' in flowers, together with refreshments, tombola and a raffle.

May I also offer a warm welcome to our summer visitors and all who find peace and refreshment in our churchyards and churches, which are open daily. Fortnightly Celtic Prayer in Surlingham churchyard offers the chance for people to come together in quiet reflection (August 8th and 22nd, September 12th and 26th, all at 10am).

In the Church of England calendar, the period from 1st September to 4th October is called the Season of Creation or Creationtide, with a particular focus on God as Creator and Sustainer of all life. In the Rockland parishes we mark this with Harvest Festivals, thanking God for the earth's fertility, the dedication of the farming community who produce our food, and workers in the production and supply chain and above all, our commitment to careful stewardship and responsible use of the world's finite resources. You are warmly invited to join us and to support others by bringing long-life items for the Norwich Food Bank and homeless projects. Please see the services calendar on the back page for dates and times.

Still at the Barn on September 17th and October 1st will reflect creation themes.

Another sign of our commitment to preserving nature and heritage is in our care for churchyards and the oldest buildings in our parishes, their churches. I would like to express my deep gratitude for those who look after them in many ways. On September 23rd 'The Birds, the Bees and the Bells' afternoon is an opportunity to have afternoon tea with us and learn more about the exciting restoration and community project that we're planning. Several of our churchyards (Carleton, Claxton, Hellington, Rockland and Surlingham) are part of a successful **Churchyard Challenge** bid and will receive DEFRA funding for wildlife support and interpretation and will be connected by a visitors' trail. 
On receiving the prize certificate and £1,000, Charlie Russell said,

# **Bugs Matter**

"Insect numbers are difficult to quantify however recent research suggests that in the UK flying insects have declined by 60% in the past 20 years. Insects provide pivotal roles for UK food security including pollination and pest or weed control".

This is a quote from the introduction to the UK Parliamentary Inquiry into Insect Decline and UK Food Security which is taking place this summer. The decline in the insect population is extremely serious as they provide a key role in supporting many systems essential to sustaining human life, such as pollinating food plants and ensuring the decay and decomposition of plant matter, as well as maintaining the delicate balance between prey and predator species that prevents us being overwhelmed by pests.

This year the drop in butterfly numbers in our area has been notable, as has the decline in insect eating birds such as swallows and swifts. The causes are manifold but the widespread use of chemical pesticides in agriculture and last year's severe drought are amongst them. There are, however, a great many things in our lives we can all do to try to help insect populations recover.

We can stop using chemicals in our gardens, have a "Wild Patch", and reduce the mowing of lawns. We can try to buy organic foods and support conservation organisations that manage land for nature. Locally we have the Chet Valley B-Line which is working hard to connect habitats to provide environmentally suitable corridors for pollinators. Plus we have the Hellington reserve and we in SWYG are running the Wild Patch Project and supporting the re-introduction of the Large Marsh Grasshopper.



Nationally **Bug Life** want people to sign up to their **Bugs Matter** project whereby people can simply download an App that enables them to count the number of bugs splattered on their number plate after a car journey. This will provide essential data on the state of UK insect populations to inform Parliament who ultimately are key decision makers in reducing chemical use and encouraging nature friendly farming in Britain.
